





### Beginners Guide to Barefooting

Competitive barefoot water skiing includes 3 events: slalom, tricks, and jump... all done on bare feet!

In the slalom event, the barefooter has two (15second) passes during which they must cross the two boat wakes as many times as possible. Each complete wake crossing scores one full point if performed on one-foot, or a half point if performed on two-feet. If the raised foot touches the water anywhere between the wake crests during a onefoot cross, it is scored as a two-foot cross. To receive full points for the second pass, it has to be performed barefooting backwards, with a one-foot backwards crossing scoring a full point and a two-



foot backwards crossing scoring a half point. If both passes are performed in the forward direction, the lowest scoring pass is reduced to one quarter of its original value.



In the trick event, the barefooter again has two 15 second passes in which to perform as many different tricks as possible. Each trick can only score once. The skier also gets points for the way they start their pass, or in other words, how they get to barefoot ski position (BSP). Tricks range from novice maneuvers like taking a hand off the handle and waving; intermediate tricks such as a tumbleturn where the barefooter sits down, spins around and stands up again; complex tricks like riding along on one foot while holding the handle with the other foot (a toe hold); to expert tricks such as somersaults and turns from forward to backward skiing positions. The 15-second time starts when the skier moves to perform their first trick.

The jump event is spectacular. Skiers ride over a fiberglass ramp that is 18-inches high and see how far they can fly before touching down. They have to stand up and regain BSP for the jump to count. There are two different styles of jumping. The more conservative approach is a normal standing position, but for maximum distance the barefooters learn the inverted jump style where they flip almost upside down on takeoff and fly like Superman, but pull their feet back under themselves for the landing. Each jumper gets 3 tries to land their longest jump.
