
The Panthers World Of Entertainment is again our major sponsor, and continues to show it's

FLIGHTCRAFT - WORLD TITLES AGAIN

Since 1988 Flightcraft have been the preferred boat at World Barefoot Championships. So lets look back on what is probably the worlds most successful outboard ski boat. The Flightcraft XLT began in 1985 when Peter Kent and David Telling modified the inboard version of the successful XL, this resulted in selection of the boat as the Official Tow Boat for the Moomba Masters which was the largest of its type in the world. It went on to break nearly every outboard three event record in Australasia towing ten Moomba Masters, three Moomba Ski Shows, Soul Olympics and World Disabled Championships.

But let's go back to 1985 when Brett Sands and the Victorian Barefoot Club skied Moomba behind this boat. Brett approached Regal Marine and said (quote) "I can break world records with that boat". At the time this seemed a bit far fetched, but none the less Regal Marine/Flightcraft went on with further development. Brett Sands smashed the world jump record and numerous slalom records. Following this others re-wrote the book behind Flightcrafts all over the world. Development has continued to improve performance and kept pace with Barefoot Water Skiing. The latest model, the 20XLT was developed in the USA and is distributed in Victoria by Regal Marine.

Barefoot Tournament Rules

Common Rules For Events

- ◆Two 15-second passes for both wake slalom and tricks events.
- ◆Timing buoys at each end of course - skier must start pass or a penalty.
- ◆3 judges in boat. Each judge writes shorthand codes of what the skier is performing and also operates a timer.
- ◆Skiers choose their own boat speeds - commonly between 40-45 mph.
- ◆There are Team Skiers and Independent Country Skiers.
- ◆All skiers use the same boat (Flightcraft powered by Mercury) and their driver is assigned.

Team Scoring

- ◆Max. 6 members on a team, plus 2 reserves. A full team must have both a male and a female competitor.
- ◆The best 3 scores (placements) out of a possible 6 (irrespective of sex) will be used to compute team scores in all 3 events.

Wake Slalom Event

- ◆"Compulsory event".
- ◆Object is to cross back and forth across the boat wake as many times as is possible in the time allowed.
- ◆Most commonly see 1 forwards skiing pass and 1 backwards skiing pass to maximise points.

- ◆A cross on 1 foot is worth more than crosses on 2 feet - 1 foot cross = 1.0 point; 1 cross on 2 feet = 0.5 points.
- ◆All skiers use the same handle and a 23m rope.

Tricks Event

- ◆"Freestyle event".
- ◆Skiers choose tricks to perform with assigned point values and different degrees of difficulty.
- ◆Skiers attempt to package combinations of tricks to get the most possible points during their trick run.
- ◆Skiers provide their own equipment (trick ropes and handles) and choose their rope length (skiing distance behind the boat).
- ◆Skiers are also awarded points for different start trick methods.

Jump Event

- ◆45cm high ramp and 1.5metre in width for both male and female competitors.
- ◆All competitors wear safety helmets and other protective equipment.
- ◆Max. speed is 70kph. Skier can ask for different boat paths through the jump course.
- ◆No style points - purely for distance only.
- ◆Must have the handle and ski past a designated 60 metre marker for the jump to have credit.
- ◆Skier given three jumps in a round.
