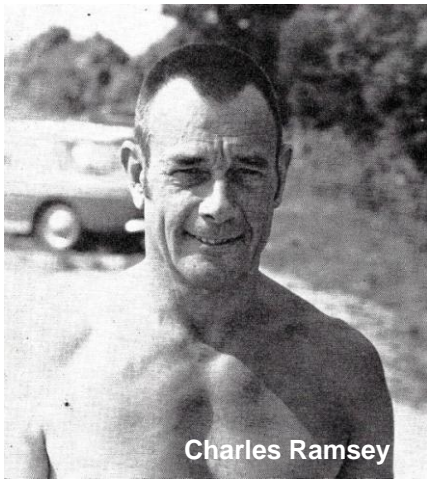

In Europe, a show team included a barefoot act as early as 1963. The first barefoot ski competition was held in Europe August the 11<sup>th</sup> of 1968, staged by the Cirencester Water Ski Club in Great Britain. The rules were a simplified version of the first rules developed by the Australians. Nine barefoot skiers took part and the event was won by Charles Ramsey, 2<sup>nd</sup> was Danny Robin and 3<sup>rd</sup> Philip Erhardt.

In 1969, the first successful jump in Europe (10.30 m) was performed. Before that time, jumping was a regular event in Australians competitions. The ramp was very little different from the official barefoot ramp of today: 4 feet wide, 12 feet long and 18 inches high (1,22 m x 3,66 m, high 45,5 cm).

The slalom course, however, was a single straight line of buoys 70 feet apart at the beginning and reducing to 20 feet apart at the end. The boat drove to one side of the course and all skiers went through at a fixed speed.

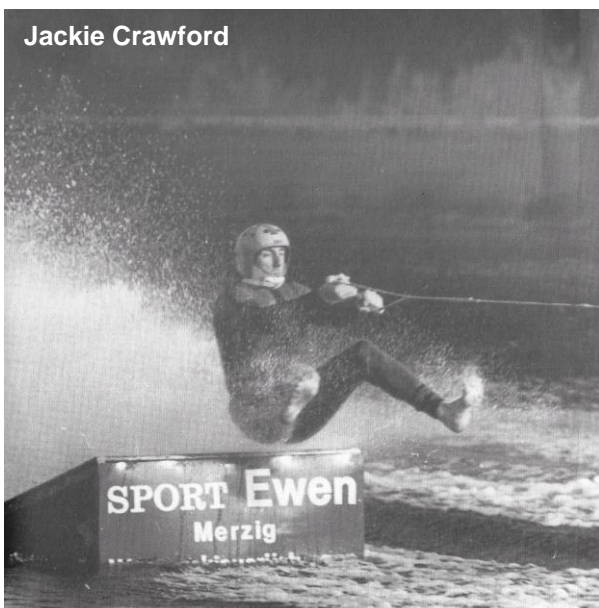
Tricks started out very modestly, with things like rope on neck and rope in teeth, tumble turns - which evolved from the skier learning to get up after falling - toeholds, and for the very few, turning to the backwards position. A sage who forecast that one day barefooters would be doing what skiers were doing on skis was laughed at.

If the Australians have been holding state and national championships since 1962, the first International barefoot competition in Europe was planned in Banolas (Spain) on September 21-22, 1974. The water conditions were perfect on this magnificent lake where the 1971 tournament World Championships were held. 24 competitors from 7 countries (Germany, Holland, Spain, Italy, Great Britain, Canada and Australia) met for the first time and the Chief judge was Sandy Primo. Australian Steve Curtis won slalom and start methods and Ger Bekker (Holland) was first in tricks with 200 points. The jump event was won by Jackie Crawford, member of the British team, with a 13.50 m jump.

In 1975, the second international barefoot event was staged in Amsterdam Boosban (Holland) on August 8-10. Sandy Primo was again chief judge, with assistant judge Rita Ramsey, the wife of Charles. Tom Skelly from Australia won slalom (220 points), tricks (390 points) and overall, with Barry Hynes (Australia) was first in start methods (400 points) and R. Van Dijk (Holland) first in jump, with 10.6 m.

Then in 1976 three international events were disputed. The Dutch international Barefoot Competition was duly held in Bosbaan on July 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>, with a sweeping victory from the British team in the overall: 1<sup>st</sup> Andy Jardine, 2<sup>nd</sup> Jackie Crawford and 3<sup>rd</sup> Bill Stevens. Then the first European barefoot championships held in Princes Club on August 21<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>th</sup>.

The week-end after, the open international competition was organised by the Palzem Wasserski Club in Germany. The event attracted most of the well-known barefooters in Europe, plus one Australian and several newcomers to competitive barefooting. The chief judge was Rita Ramsey, assisted by Ken Port from Great Britain. Alan Moffatt of Australia won the overall, with Mike Thomas second and Andy Jardine third...

# EUROPEAN BAREFOOT CHAMPIONSHIPS 1976

PRINCES WATER SKI CLUB 21/22 AUGUST

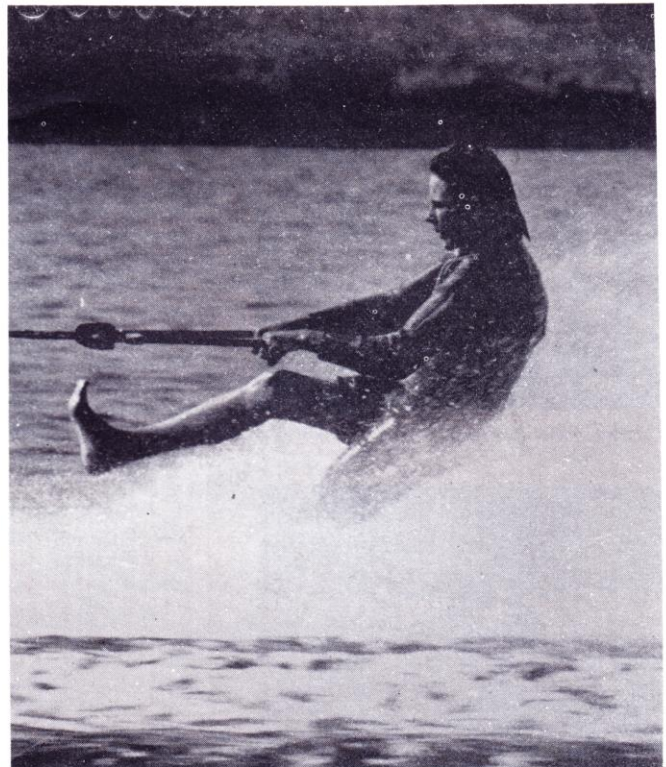

Given the luxurious venue of the Princes Water Ski Club, and full television coverage, barefooters from all over Europe rose to the occasion and set new records in all events except tricks.

In line with the new regulations governing this grade of competition, it was a two-day event, with two rounds in each discipline. The best score on either day winning the individual gold medals, and the skier's best rating on either day going forward for the overall total. A simple system in theory, but one that can produce strange results. As an example, the well-liked Norbort Grzegorzcyk from West Germany, appeared from nowhere to come second overall. The more erudite wives and supporters could be seen in corners making endless calculations as the results were posted.

The Championships started on the Saturday morning with start methods. The previous best in Europe has been a maximum of 125 points from a feet off flying beach plus a tumble start, and there are about ten Europeans who can achieve this level. However, Dennis Atkins and Bill Stevens of Great Britain and Charles Ramsey from Holland now have proficiency certificates for the backward start method of stepping off a ski. When it came to the rather cruel rough water of Princes, all failed except "Doom" Stevens, tough ex-mercenary from the Gosfield Lake Water Ski Club, who managed the backwards and threw in a one foot stand-up for good measure.

A new record and a well deserved gold for Bill.

The second event was tricks and was won easily by young Mike Thomas from Oxford with 330 points. This score was not bettered by any competitor on either day and made young "Sparrow" the gold medalist. Tricks was the only discipline in which records were not broken, possibly due to the rough water. It being generally accepted that this discipline is the most sensitive to water conditions.

More surprises in the slalom event. Mike Thomas (G.B.) and Paco Fernandez from Spain skating through with easy looking one foot crossings. Young Mike making 260 points and Paco 180 points. Again, these scores were not bettered on the second day, making Mike a double gold medalist.

The first round jumping made a strange start as a succession of quite competent skiers failed to land. However, after Doom Stevens landed once and missed once, he rightly pronounced the jump to be not level. After the point was somewhat reluctantly taken by the judges, an adjustment was made and those who wished were able to jump again. This incident altered the scoring somewhat and led Keith Donnelly to a massive leap of 13.25 metres. Another record and a gold for Keith. Not really surprising to the knowledgeable few who have had the substantial figure of young Donnelly under observation since the Nationals. The opinion was held that if ever he landed it would be a long one, and so it proved. This may be the beginning of the end for the feet to feet men with their 30 per cent bonus, since they have now been caught by a bum (sic.) lander with a larger raw score.

The first day ended with a magnificent barbecue laid on by the Princes Club, with an entire pig rotating on the spit, suitably reinforced with a splendid array of side dishes. By nature a hardy creature, the average barefooter really appreciated the luxury of this tournament. Hot sun and showers, real toilets, new jetties, an efficient bar and generous portions of high standard food.

Sunday started with slightly rougher water which worsened marginally as the day wore on. Television appeared with the usual trappings of hydraulic towers and paraphernalia, and gave us excellent coverage. Drawing upon a lifetime's lack of interests in tricks. Doom Stevens gave a brief lecture on this discipline in front of the cameras. A make-up girl hovered briefly but wisely gave up when she saw the nose plaster.

In the second day start methods, with the worsening conditions, eight skiers achieved the maximum 1,000 points and a silver medal each. Scores down in the slalom, but still excellent results from Thomas, Fernandez and V. Posca from Italy.

The final round of tricks event was marred by an injury to Paco Fernandez from Spain, who aggravated an old knee injury whilst attempting a tumble turn. An efficient rescue service brought him in on the floating stretcher and he recovered to mobility, with a severe limp, within an hour or so.

The finals of the jumping event brought no surprises. K. Donnelly confirmed his newly found dominance with a final leap of 12.80 metres, thus winning the gold by a comfortable margin.

All the events were enlivened by the eighth member of the British Team, the attractive Penny Lowden. With neat figure and long blonde hair streaming in the wind, she presented a pretty sight on and off the water and attracted reporters and cameras from far and wide. A welcome change from the hideous appearance of the average barefooter.

The calculators now retired to deliberate, and the skiers celebrated supposed coming triumphs, or drowned their sorrows according to temperament. In a corner of the bar, Doom Stevens could be seen demonstrating a dry backwards step off, for the fiftieth time, to an unwilling captive audience, who either gazed at him with an unseeing glazed stare, or glanced about uneasily seeking an escape.

Then a whisper from the bar entrance, growing to a crescendo — — it's Mike Thomas!!!!

Sixteen year old Mike the new European Overall Champion. Handshakes, champagne and he was duly launched in splendid style.

The medal presentation was raised by an elegant and witty speech from Davic

Spyer and by the dignified style of a Leisure Sports' Director who did the honours.

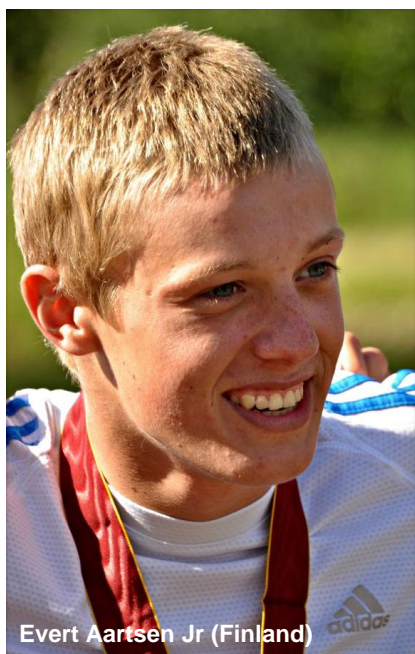

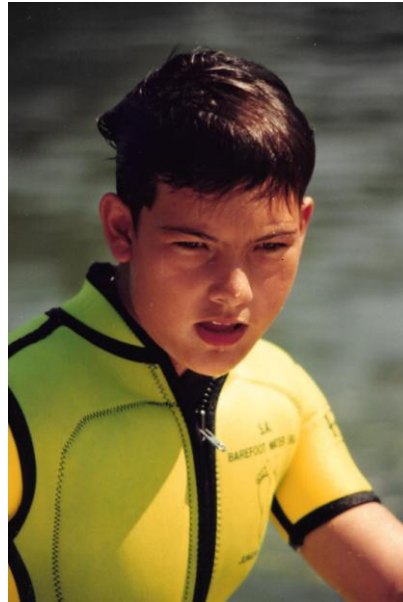

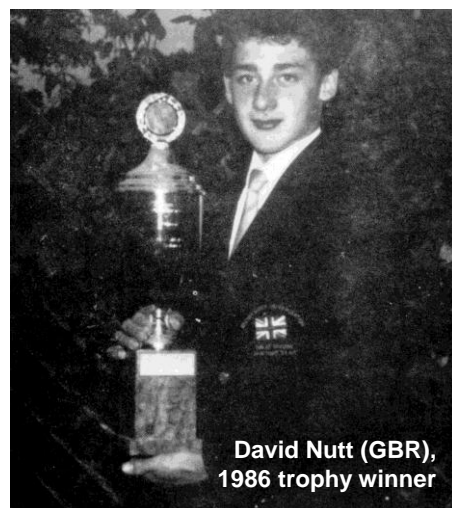
# EUROPEAN CHALLENGE AND GRAND PRIX WINNERS

Only two years after the first European Championships, the *European Challenge Series* was created. Initially planned to give skiers the opportunity to meet themselves more often than during World and European Championships only, it was also the possibility for countries to organise international events.

From 1978 to 1990, this "tour" was called *European Cup* and *European Challenge Series*, with a calculation system very close to the formula 1 racing championships, where top skiers in each event received 20, 17, 14, 12 points... At the end of the *Challenge Finals*, the points were added to crown the winners in men and women divisions.

From 1991 to 1998, the words *Grand Prix* were used. Each competition was autonomous and the name of the hosting country or club was added to *Grand Prix* in order to have a greater prestige. The way of doing the calculation has also changed, with an overall calculation based on all added points for each event.

Since 1999, there was a radical change with the introduction of the Meridian League, with a team results and divisions for men and women.

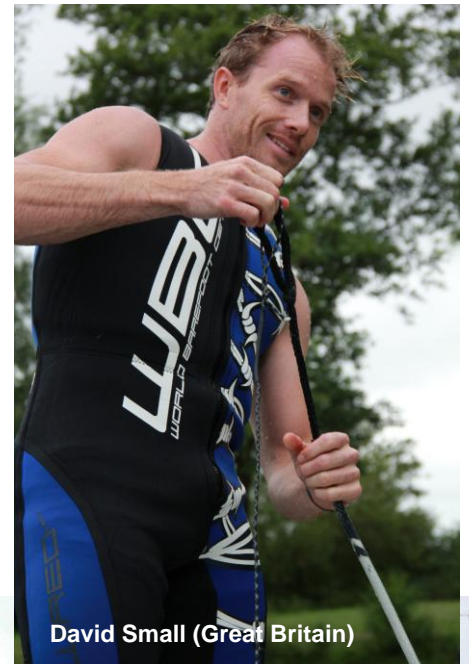
